BACKGROUND:

At the November 12, 2012 General Election, voters in the Village of Bensenville approved a Referendum authorizing the Village to operate an opt-out electric aggregation program for resident and small business ratepayers. Municipal Aggregation is a program by which a Village can aggregate the load of its residents and small businesses (who have not individually selected their own supplier) and negotiate for advantageous rates and terms for the ratepayer.

Over the last year, residents had reverted back to the ComEd base rate due to bids not being competitive.

KEY ISSUES:

NIMEC will conduct a competitive bid process and present results to the Village Board. Electric pricing is a commodity, so pricing is only held firm for 24 hours. NIMEC will provide pricing that evening for different term options, from 12 months to 36 months. If bid accepted at June 12 meeting, program could begin at August 2020 meter read dates as implementation requires a process that follows several regulatory procedures and coordination with ComEd that takes 70-80 days once the Village contracts with a supplier.

Some key features of a Municipal Aggregation program:

- All residents informed (via postal mail, paid by Supplier) of rate and term prior to program commencement
- No hard costs to the Village to establish a program
- Any resident may opt out at any time; will never incur a termination fee

Nearly 5,000 ratepayer accounts were enrolled at the program's inception in 2013 for a cumulative program savings approaching \$2 million. Since the program's suspension in September 2019, NIMEC has continued to monitor the market, seeking indicative competitive bids from active suppliers for the Village. Until recently, lowest bids received were higher than the ComEd default rate.

The annualized ComEd Price to Compare for the period June 2020 to May 2021 is 6.842¢ per kWh. A monthly Purchased Electricity Adjustment of +/- 0.5¢ per kWh.

The new arrangement will allow for all residents to be charged no more than the ComEd base rate, a portion of the energy will be generated from green sources, and the Village will receive a civic contribution from the winning electric energy supplier. This method will optimize the aggregate load of our residents.

**ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING RENEWAL OF
AGGREGATION PROGRAM FOR ELECTRICAL LOAD**

WHEREAS, Under Section 1-92 of the Illinois Power Agency Act, 20 ILCS 3855/1-1, et seq., (the “Act”) a municipality may operate an electric aggregation program as an opt-out program for residential and small commercial retail customers, if a referendum is passed by a majority vote of the residents pursuant to the requirements under the Act; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Bensenville (“Village”) submitted the question to referendum on November 6, 2012, and a majority of the electors voting on the question voted in the affirmative; and

WHEREAS, the Village subsequently implemented its initial opt-out aggregation program in 2013 with the term of the supplier agreement to end based on scheduled final meter read dates in January 2016; and subsequently renewed the program with a term of the supplier agreement to end based on scheduled final meter read dates in September 2019; and

WHEREAS over 5,000 resident and small business electric accounts were originally enrolled in the program, and the aggregate savings have totaled nearly \$2,000,000 throughout the entire community; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities hereby find that it is in the best interest of the Village to continue to operate the aggregation program under the Act as an opt-out program and to enter into an additional contract with a supplier pursuant to the terms of the Act.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Village Board of the Village of Bensenville, Cook County, Illinois, As Follows:

SECTION 1: That the Preamble of this Ordinance is declared to be true and correct and is incorporated by reference herein.

SECTION 2:

- A. Pursuant to Section 1-92 of the Illinois Power Agency Act, 20 ILCS 3855/1-1, et seq., (the “Act”) the Corporate Authorities of the Village are hereby authorized to aggregate, in accordance with the terms of the Act, residential and small commercial retail electrical loads located within the corporate limits of the Village, and for that purpose may solicit bids and enter into

service agreements to facilitate for those loads the sale and purchase of electricity and related services and equipment.

- B. The Aggregation Program for the Village shall continue to operate as an opt-out program for residential and small commercial retail customers.
- C. As an opt-out program, the Corporate Authorities of the Village shall fully inform residential and small commercial retail customers in advance that they have the right to opt-out of the Aggregation Program before the resident or commercial account is renewed. The disclosure and information provided to the customers shall comply with the requirements of the Act.
- D. The Corporate Authorities hereby grant Village Manager, Evan K. Summers, the specific authority to execute a contract without further action by the Corporate Authorities and with the authority to bind the Village.
- E. The Village will engage NIMEC, who has managed over 300 municipal aggregation program bids and implementations. NIMEC will solicit bids from multiple suppliers and consult with the Village in our decision to select the supplier that best meets our needs. NIMEC will also assist with the conversion process, and provide assistance to residents with questions.

SECTION 3: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

EXIST AND IS NECESSARY TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY AND

WHEREAS, the Village of Bensenville, DuPage and Cook Counties, Illinois (the “*Village*”) is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

WHEREAS, the Village President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bensenville (the “*Corporate Authorities*”) are charged with the responsibility of protecting the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19, also known as the "coronavirus," is a dangerous disease which has spread around the world, including in the United States, the State of Illinois, DuPage County and Village of Bensenville; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a direct and serious threat to the public's health, safety and welfare; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Illinois issued a disaster proclamation on March 9, 2020 due to the COVID-19 disease outbreak; and

WHEREAS, on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the COVID-19 disease outbreak a worldwide global pandemic; and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States of America declared a national state of emergency on March 13, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the DuPage County Board Chairman issued a disaster proclamation on March 16, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 20, 2020, the Governor of the State of Illinois issued Executive Order 2020-10, a "Stay at Home" order, allowing only "essential businesses" to operate and limiting the movement of persons in Illinois in order to slow the spread of COVID-19, which has a significant and material impact on Village residents and businesses; and

WHEREAS, on March 24, 2020, the Village President declared a state of emergency in the Village; and

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2020, the Governor of the State of Illinois extended the disaster proclamation for an additional thirty (30) days; and

WHEREAS, on April 1, 2020, the Governor of the State of Illinois issued Executive Order 2020-18, extending the "Stay at Home" order through April 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on April 14, 2020, the Village President issued a second declaration of the state of emergency in the Village; and

WHEREAS, on April 28, 2020, the Village President issued a third declaration of the state of emergency in the Village; and

WHEREAS, the March 24, 2020, April 14, 2020 and April 28, 2020 declarations were made pursuant to authority granted to the Village President in Chapter Two of Title Four of the Bensenville Village Code, entitled "Emergencies" and pursuant to Section 5/11-1-6 of the Illinois Municipal Code and Section 3305/11 of the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act; and

WHEREAS, the current declaration will expire upon adjournment of the regular meeting of the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Bensenville, Illinois, on May 12, 2020; and

WHEREAS, based on the gubernatorial disaster proclamations as well as Executive Order 2020-10 and Executive Order 2020-18 of the Governor of the State of Illinois, the Corporate Authorities hereby find that the third declaration continuing the state of emergency in the Village on April 28, 2020 was in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 virus is still causing or anticipated to cause widespread impacts on the health of members of the community; and

WHEREAS, on April 30, 2020, the Governor of the State of Illinois extended the disaster proclamation for an additional thirty (30) days; and

WHEREAS, on April 30, 2020, the Governor of the State of Illinois issued Executive Order 2020-32, to amend and extend the “Stay at Home” order through May 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, until expiration of the current gubernatorial disaster proclamation or unless sooner terminated by the Village President indicating that the emergency no longer exists in the Village, whichever occurs first, the Corporate Authorities support and approve the intent of the Village President to issue a fourth declaration of a state of emergency in the Village on May 12, 2020 to ensure vital emergency services and functions continue to operate and provide needed relief to the residents and businesses of the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bensenville, DuPage and Cook Counties, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. The Corporate Authorities find and determine that this Ordinance is necessary, desirable and in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village of Bensenville.

Section 3. The Declaration of a State of Emergency Village of Bensenville, DuPage and Cook Counties, Illinois issued by the Village President on April 28, 2020, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A, is hereby ratified and approved.

Section 4. The Declaration of a State of Emergency Village of Bensenville, DuPage and Cook Counties, Illinois expected to be issued by the Village President on May 12, 2020 continuing the current state of emergency in the Village, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit B, is hereby authorized and approved.

Section 5. The officials, officers, attorneys and consultants of the Village are hereby authorized to undertake actions on the part of the Village as contained in and pursuant to a Declaration of a State of Emergency issued by the Village President to complete satisfaction of the provisions, terms or conditions stated therein.

Section 6. This Ordinance, and its parts, are declared to be severable and any section, paragraph, clause, provision, or portion of this Ordinance that is declared invalid shall not affect the validity of any other provision of this Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 7. The findings and recitals herein are declared to be prima facie evidence of the law of the Village and shall be received in evidence as provided by the Illinois Compiled Statutes and the courts of the State of Illinois.

Section 8. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 9. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

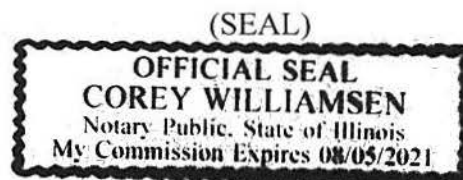

WHEREAS, the Village of Bensenville, DuPage and Cook Counties, Illinois (the “*Village*”) is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, as from time to time supplemented and amended; and

WHEREAS, the Village President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bensenville (the “*Corporate Authorities*”) have the power and authority to amend the Bensenville Village Code as deemed necessary and advisable to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities find that it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village to provide for the regulations herein specified.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Bensenville, DuPage and Cook Counties, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. The Corporate Authorities find and determine that it is necessary and desirable to amend the Bensenville Village Code for the purpose set forth herein and that the adoption of this Ordinance is in the best interests of the Village.

Section 3. Section 5-2-13 (“*No Parking Zones*”) of Chapter Two (“*Stopping, Standing or Parking*”) of Title 5 (“*Traffic and Motor Vehicles*”) of the Bensenville Village Code is hereby amended as follows:

5-2-13: NO PARKING ZONES:

When signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle at the times indicated upon any of the following streets or areas: (1976 Code § 41.22)

F. No parking at any time:

Gateway Road, either side, from Meyer Road west to the western end of Gateway Road.

Section 4. Section 5-2-14 (“*No Parking Zones*”) of Chapter Two (“*Stopping, Standing or Parking*”) of Title 5 (“*Traffic and Motor Vehicles*”) of the Bensenville Village Code is hereby amended as follows:

5-2-14: LIMITED PARKING ZONES:

When signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall park a vehicle for a longer period than indicated on any of the following streets or areas: (Ord. 8-2004, 1-20-2004)

A. Two Hours At Any Time:

Gateway Road, either side, from York Road to Meyer Road.

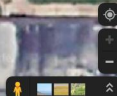
